Short description: At the end of August 2012 the Summer School »Relations between the EU and the emerging global players« will take place in Göttingen (Germany) for the third time. Students and professors from twelve European universities will discuss the economic, commercial and political relations between the EU and emerging global players with emphasis on China and India. Participants will enjoy a rich programme consisting of lectures, research tasks and excursions. Furthermore students will take part in the simulation of a meeting of the European Council during which they will represent one EU member state and discuss a current topic.
