Procedure

Most important : Partners universities shall send nominations to marie.laure.allix@univ-poitiers.fr specifying full name, gender, field of study, duration of stay and e-mail address of the nominated student(s).

Application procedure: once selected by their home university, each student will be contacted directly for application procedure, and all useful information will be provided.

D e a d l i n e s :

Nomination/Application Deadline for the first semester and whole year : 15th of June
Nomination/Application for the second semester : 15th of November

Courses open to exchange students

Faculty of Economics delivers some courses in English. Courses have to be chosen by the Erasmus student before his/her arrival in Poitiers. This choice must be accepted by the coordinator of the home university.

European Community Course Credit Transfer System - ECTS

This system was put in place by the European Community Commission in order to help students make the most of their study abroad experience. It measures and compares academic results and transfers them from one institute to another. The Faculty of Economics of Poitiers has applied this system to all the universities with which it has signed agreements (whether they are European or not).

The ECTS credits are values assigned to each course for the volume of work in each course in relation to the volume of work necessary to complete a full academic year at the institute.

The ECTS grading scale has been put in place by the institutions participating in the pilot program in order to facilitate the interpretation of grades obtained by the students. The ECTS grading scale in no way replaces the grading system already in place locally ; the ECTS grades represent complementary information on the grades given to the student by the institution in which he or she is studying.

Grading Scale

French language courses

Incoming students can follow French courses at the "Center of French as a Foreign Language" (CFLE) of University of Poitiers. Erasmus+ students with a level in French B1 or B2 uncertified will take a course funded by the Erasmus+ program, in limited number. These courses takes place within the Faculty of Literature and languages on the main campus.

Health Insurance

Students from the European Union: the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) exempts European students from French student health insurance schemes and covers most medical or pharmaceutical costs incurred in France.

Non-European Students are under the legal obligation to enroll at the social security scheme or the basic health insurance scheme.

Erasmus student Network (ESN) and Buddy System

Erasmus Student Network (ESN) is a non-profit international student organization. Its mission is to represent international students, thus provide opportunities for cultural understanding and self-development under the principle of Students Helping Students .

The Buddy System is a programme through which incoming exchange students are matched with students of the University of Poitiers.
